### **Fall programs for preschoolers**

The library's Youth Services Supervisor, Anna Doyle, offers two weekly programs for the preschool set. Every Monday, at 10 a.m., Anna has scheduled a "Sing and Play" session for two-to-five-year olds. It includes singing, dancing, and funny stories, all designed to explore rhythm, sounds, and words.

Every Wednesday, at 10:30 a.m., "Preschool Storytime" Anna or one of her guests reads a couple of story books selected for a pre-school audience. The stories are followed by a craft activity designed to boost early literacy.
